Brain research and anger management physiology.

Anger management group and individual pre-assessment inventories, anger survey, evaluation, and progress tools. Ethical guidelines for anger management specialists.

Assessment and referral for major mental health disorders (DSM-V) associated with anger problems.

Contraindications for anger management treatment.

Empirically supported psycho-educational treatments for anger control problems: assertiveness, time out, problem-solving, conflict management, forgiveness interventions. Strategies for increasing motivation of (court-ordered) resistant clients/students. Overview of Emotional Intelligence and developing empathy for managing anger.
